## BC Indoor Championships, March 26 & 27

NOTE: changes for this year: The BCAA Indoor Championship has adopted the Archery Canada / World Archery scoring rules for an 18m round. **ALL compound shooters**, regardless of age or category, will score based on the inner-10 ring. (see rule AC 7.2.2.3.) No X's will be written on any scorecards. Medals will be awarded accordingly. (no changes for non-compound categories)

## Guest Insurance reporting — DUE NOW

REMINDER TO CLUB ADMINS:

October 31 was the reporting deadline to supply the BCAA with your "guest" and "short-term participant" figures. If you haven't yet submitted your numbers, please do so asap to the [VP-Admin](#).

As per the [policy online](#), each club is required to submit not only the total number of guests but also a copy of the register kept. These figures are then forwarded to Archery Canada, who in turn forward the figures from all the Canadian clubs to the Insurance carrier. Once the BCAA receives an invoice from Archery Canada, an invoice will be sent to your club for payment of the "per person per event" fee. In 2014 the amount assessed was \$0.20 per person per day.

This does not include anyone who is a valid member of the BCAA, although it may include them if they used your facilities prior to becoming a BCAA member.
