## 2015 Athlete and Coach Carding Cycle

The 2015 Notifications for BC Carding of Targeted Athletes and their coaches went out to recipients on January 16<sup>th</sup> 2016 by e-mail.

The list of carded athletes and the updated criteria will be posted on the BCAA website.

### What is Pacific Sport Carding and what benefits, programs and support services am I eligible for?

The criteria to be Carded is accessible on the BCAA website within the Athlete Stuff link and updated annually. A carded athlete is on the High Performance Pathway and is demonstrating competitive and performance metrics. Once registered as a carded athlete, you *may* be able to access numerous athlete support benefits, services and programs such as:

- Community Partnerships (discounted products/services at selected retailers).
- GymWorks™ (free gym access at numerous partner facilities).
- Free Education Programs (Athlete Advance™, Sport Performance Speaker Series, Athlete Readiness Seminars).

## BC Archers on the 2016 Olympic Pathway

Go BC! Hugh MacDonald and Brian Maxwell will be heading off to the Olympic Training center in San Diego in early February. Hugh and Brian are two of the top 6 Senior Recurve male athletes who have been identified by Archery Canada as being on the 2016 Olympic pathway. Additionally Linda Price was selected by Archery Canada to attend under the Developmental Coach pathway.

## America's Masters Games

Want to be part of something special right here in your own backyard? Are you an archer, age 50 or older, who is interested in shooting a couple of 720-rounds and some match/set-play?



Well have I got an event for you! The inaugural America's Masters Games is being held in Vancouver, and Archery is one of 25 sports participating in this Master-only event.

Archery will take place from August 27th to 31st. Competition will be based on gender (M/F), age (50-59, 60-69, 70+), and equipment (Compound, Recurve and Barebow).

The event consists of 2 days of qualifying rounds (a 720-round each day) and a day of single-elimination rounds.

Recurves shoot 60m on a 122cm target, Barebows shoot 50m on a 122cm target, and Compounds shoot 50m on a 6-ring (cut-down) 80cm target (only blue, red & yellow rings showing).
