Cannabis in Sport

Some of you may have received the Athlete's Corner email from Archery Canada this week. The lead message is with regard to upcoming legislation:

The Government of Canada plans to legalize cannabis as early as summer 2018. Athletes subject to the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) must be aware that this does not affect the status of cannabis in sport. Cannabis continues to be a prohibited substance and a positive test can still result in a sanction. Visit the [CCES website](#) for more information.

Basically, if you participate in archery events, this drug is and will continue to be prohibited even after legalization. If you require the use of this drug for medical purposes, be sure to obtain a medical exemption prior to participating in an event.

2018 Nationals—Truro, Nova Scotia

All 3 events of the [Canadian Championships](#) will be held in Truro, Nova Scotia.

- 3D Nationals starts the event on August 3rd, running through August 6th.
- Field Nationals runs August 7th & 8th (practice on the 7th, event on the 8th).
- Following Field is the Target Nationals, August 9th to 11th.
- Rounding out the Championships is the Canadian Open, the individual match-play event, on Sunday August 12th.

BC Outdoor Championships—Prince George

Save the date! Silvertip Archers is once again hosting the BC Outdoor Championships on Labour Day weekend—August 31 to September 2. [Registration](#) is open now.



This year's event will contest a single 720-round on Saturday with a 24-target Field round on Sunday. Saturday will also feature a

BBQ lunch followed by a FUN 2-person match-play event. The match-play will facilitate a competition chart used by the Netherlands in their Lowlands event. Everyone shoots until the end, no matter how many matches they lose. Every team should get 4 matches. The event will be shot at 60m on a 122cm target. Teams may be made up 2 "stick" bows, two "wheeled" bows, or one of each. The person at the end of the 720-round with the highest score will be matched with the person with the lowest score, moving toward the middle. Yes, we have a method to convert everyone's 50m, 70m, etc, scores to a 60m equivalent. You'll just have to come the BC Outdoors if you want to see how it works!

More details will be posted on our [event page](#) as soon as available.

NOTE: Silvertip is also holding an additional registered 720-round on Friday during the practice. If you wish to participate, cost is \$10 on-site and scoring starts at 1pm. This is not counted as part of the Championships.

(You must shoot the Saturday 720 **and** Sunday Field to qualify for medals)

The AGM will be held on Friday August 31st, 7pm, Silvertip Indoor venue. More details will be emailed to the membership 14-days prior to the AGM.

BC Athletes are competing all over the World!

August and September are busy months for a few of our BC Athletes.

Pan American and ParaPan American Championships, August 14-19, Medellin, Columbia. Four BC's are headed to South America in August. Brendan von Richter (Sr Cmp), Jordan Adachi (Jr Cmp) and Mariessa Pinto (Jr Recurve) will compete in the Pan American Championships, while Kevin Evans will compete in the Para Pan Ams.

The inaugural World Archery Masters Championships is taking place in Lausanne, Switzerland, August 14-19. Three of our BC athletes are heading to Europe to take part in this event, which contests an Indoor 18m round, a 720-round and a Field round. Be sure to [follow](#) Al Campsall (Cmp, 60-69 years), Mike Poole (BB, 60-69yrs) and Sergey Bolutenko (Recurve, 50-59yrs).



Canada Winter Games—update

The declared athletes can submit 18m round scores up until Nov 4th.

The TOP 4 athletes in each category of male and female compound and recurve will be notified before November 9th that they have been invited to a final selection event on the weekend of November 24-25 in Oliver.



The final selection event will consist of an 18m round and match play. The TOP athlete in each category will represent BC at the Canada Winter Games held Feb 15-March 3rd in Red Deer Alberta.



