Did you know...

That the Archery Canada Outdoor Nationals is awarded to the Provinces on a 9-year rotational basis? The last time BC hosted was in 2012, where the 3D was held in Vernon and the Field/Target was held on the Island. These are lucrative, high profile events for archery in Canada. Not only do the athletes get to compete all over the country with other athletes of their calibre, but the host clubs in each province get to showcase their skills and venues and rake in some revenue for their efforts.

Nationals will be returning to Beautiful British Columbia in 2021. In the coming weeks our member-clubs will be receiving an email request for “Expression of Interest” in hosting Nationals. Please be sure to discuss this opportunity with your club board and follow the instructions in the email request. Nationals will be hosted in Saskatchewan in 2019 and PEI in 2020.

NEW Membership forms for 2019

The [new 2019 membership forms](#) have been posted to the website and emailed to all the member-club contacts. Anyone can renew their membership now and have it valid through the end of 2019—no need to wait for the confetti to drop on New Year’s; get ahead of the game and don’t risk missing out on tournaments and benefits.

If you print and mail your renewal, please be sure to use the *new* forms as any old forms received with old fee amounts will be returned.

The 2019 BC Archery fee structure is as follows:

- ⇒ Youth (born in 2002-2018): \$65
- ⇒ Adults (born in 1900-2001): \$75
- ⇒ Family, max 2 Adults and unlimited Youth residing in same household: \$160
- ⇒ Club: \$160

Guest Insurance Reports due October 31st

All member clubs are reminded that the Guest Insurance reporting is due on October 31st. If you rely on BC Archery / Archery Canada insurance, you need to follow the [Instructions and Guidelines](#) as posted on the website. Failure to report these numbers may result in your insurance being void. If your club has private insurance, or coverage through another association, you are not required to follow these Guidelines.

BC Outdoor results

Silvertip Archers hosted a great, albeit [cold](#), [2018 BC Outdoor](#) event. The 2-day event contested a 720-round on Saturday with a Field-round on Sunday for 44 competitors. [18 records](#) were set/broken on Labour Day weekend.

Saturday was also the 2-person match-play fun event, where young and old, sticks and wheels, were placed into mixed-up pairs and competed in matches against another pair. The matches followed the Netherland’s Lowlands grid, where, instead of single– or double-elimination, all pairs competed in matches right up until the gold medal match was over. This grid format allowed everyone to play in at least 4 matches, allowing for more experience, and more fun. In the end, the team of Rick S (Master Compound) and Shelby B (Cadet Recurve) finished in the top spot, winning Silvertip hats, pins and BC Archery mugs.



Seeking bids for BC Outdoors & JOP Indoors/Outdoors

We are still looking for bids from clubs to host the 2019 BC Outdoors and the JOP Indoors and Outdoors.

The BC Outdoors format can be any combination of 1200-round, 720-round and Field-round. The match-play fun-event was well received this year and could potentially draw more participants next year, so it is asked the bidding clubs strongly consider hosting the same format as 2018 if possible. The JOP Indoor and JOP Outdoor Championships are meant to be held in 3 or 4 venues around the province in order to make travelling to the event easier, less-expensive, and still have the youth competing with athletes from more than just their own club. As Easter is late this year, we ask that the JOP Indoors be held earlier in April. The JOP Outdoors is not to be held on the same weekend as the 3D Championships (Jun22-23)—the weekend before would be optimal. Please [submit](#) your [bid form](#) by October 25th.
